






Map of Numbered Treaties of Canada. Borders are approximated. CC BY-SA 3.0 - Wikimedia.org







Status of the Artist

- COVID-19 crisis has exposed hypocrisy about artists and their labour
- Centrality of Artists in Society
- Atypical nature of work
- Governs the understanding of Labour and income
- Cultural labour is a Provincial subject
- Federal & Provincial Legislation
- 40 year old issue



State of the Artists

Labour and Income

- Artists earn 43% less than general labour
- Artists faced similar EXCLUSION in LABOUR LAW like the
- Farm Workers
- Migrant Workers
- Domestic Workers
- Poverty, Homelessness, Hunger, Mental Health issues
- Consequences: Increased Marginalization, Loss of dignity


The Independent Artists Union was established in Ontario in the spring of 1984 on the belief that artists not only deserve, but have the right to a decent and secure living. In forming the union, artists were determined to do away with the tired old myth that states artists' creativity thrives in conditions of poverty. An artist's needs are basically the same as those of other workers. People work

better when they have a secure and liveable income, when they have the protection of health benefits and the knowledge that a pension plan is in place for their future. These are things that most Canadians take for granted. These are things that most artists do not have.



We represent tens of thousands of artists, writers, technicians, and performers from many backgrounds and regions across Canada. Our voices are united; we call upon the Government of Canada to ensure the financial well-being of all residents by implementing a permanent Basic Income Guarantee.

The pandemic's wrath on lives has been swift. Millions are still out of work. Those whose financial situation was not previously precarious find themselves sinking into financial quicksand, their lives instantly upended through no fault of their own. The arts, culture, heritage, tourism, and creative industries have been deeply affected: productions have been canceled, venues shuttered, and livelihoods lost. In these unprecedented times, millions of Canadians, including those in the arts and culture sector, exist in a precarious reality. In this new reality, we are all vulnerable to unexpected changes in circumstances and unexpected hardships. Poverty can become a reality for all of us, abruptly, without warning.


